Mayor Anderson called the meeting to order; whereupon Reverend Marshall Boroughs of the East Naples Baptist Church gave the Invocation followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

AGENDA ITEM 3. Approval of minutes

Mayor Anderson called the Council's attention to the minutes of the Regular Meeting of March 21, 1979; whereupon Mr. Wood moved to accept the minutes as presented, seconded by Mr. Twerdahl and carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM 4. A resolution commending Clyde M. Chesser for his dedicated service as a Fireman and Assistant Fire Chief of the City of Naples; and providing an effective date. Requested by City Manager.

Mayor Anderson read the above titled resolution in its entirety; whereupon Mr. Thornton moved to adopt Resolution 3216, seconded by Mr. McGrath and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 5. PUBLIC HEARING: Second Reading of ordinances.

AGENDA ITEM 5-a. An ordinance rezoning all of Lot 20, except the west 3-1/3 feet thereof and all of Lot 21, Block 21, Tier 8, Town of Naples, Plat Book 1, Page 8, Public Records of Collier County, Florida, from "R1-7.5", Single Family Residential, to "O", Office; directing that the official zoning atlas be revised accordingly; and providing an effective date. Purpose: To rezone said property at the request of the property owner.

Mayor Anderson opened the Public Hearing at 9:09 a.m.; whereupon City Attorney Rynders read the above titled ordinance by title for Council's consideration on Second Reading. Joseph Kingsley, Tyler Janney, Saul Gottlieb, Louis J. Doria, John Reeder, Thomas Burns, David Burns. Marjorie King, Olive Kent, Louise Kuhlman and Arnold Lamm spoke in opposition to the proposed re-zoning. Mr. Janney read a letter from Jon R. Tate (Attachment #1) into the record, opposing the re-zoning. Harry Rothchild addressed the Council criticizing the ordinance that Council passed eliminating the joint Public Hearing with the Planning Advisory Board. There being no one else to speak for or against, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 9:41 a.m. Mr. Schroeder moved that this change in zoning be denied, seconded by Mr. Twerdahl and carried on roll call vote, 6-1 with Mr. Holland voting no.

AGENDA ITEM 5-b. An ordinance rezoning Lots 21, 22, 23 and 24 and the south 10 feet of the east 133-1/3 feet of the vacated east-west alley, Block 7, Tier 8, Plan of Naples, Plat Book 1, Page 8, Public Records of Collier County, Florida, from "C-1", Commercial, to "R3T-12", Multi-family Residential; directing that the official zoning atlas be revised to reflect said change in zoning; and providing an effective date. Purpose: To rezone said property at the request of the property owner.

City Attorney Rynders read the above referenced ordinance by title for Council's consideration on Second Reading; whereupon Mayor Anderson opened the Public Hearing at 9:45 a.m. There being no one to speak for or against, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 9:46 a.m. Mr. Twerdahl moved to adopt Ordinance 3217 on Second Reading, seconded by Mr. Schroeder and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 5-c. An ordinance prohibiting the sale of drug-related paraphernalia; providing definitions for the terms used herein; and providing an effective date. Purpose: To reduce the incidents of illegal drug use.

City Attorney Rynders read the above captioned ordinance by title for consideration by Council on Second Reading. Mayor Anderson opened the Public Hearing at 9:50 a.m. and Bill Barton addressed Council briefly, repeating the appreciation on the part of the Naples Informed Parents group for Council's cooperation. There being no one else to speak for or against, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 9:51 a.m.; whereupon Mr. Thornton moved adoption of Ordinance 3218 on Second Reading, seconded by Mr. Schroeder and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 5-d. An ordinance prohibiting the advertisement of drug-related paraphernalia; prohibiting the sale of such advertisements; providing definitions for the terms used herein; providing a severability clause, and providing an effective date. Purpose: To prohibit advertisement of drug-related paraphernalia or the sale of such advertisements in the City of Naples.

City Attorney Rynders read the above titled ordinance by title for consideration by Council on Second Reading; whereupon Mayor Anderson opened the Public Hearing at 9:52 a.m. A lady in the audience inquired whether or not this ordinance would include radio advertising to which City Attorney Rynders replied in the affirmative. There being no one else to speak for or against, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 9:53 a.m. Mr. Thornton moved adoption of Ordinance 3219 on Second Reading, seconded by Mr. Schroeder and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 5-e. An ordinance prohibiting the sale of drug-related printed matter to minors; providing definitions for the terms used herein; providing a severability clause; and providing an effective date. Purpose: To prohibit the sale of drug-related printed matter to minors.

City Attorney Rynders read the above captioned ordinance by title for Council's consideration on Second Reading; whereupon Mayor Anderson opened the Public Hearing at 9:54 a.m. There being no one to speak for or against, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 9:55 a.m.; whereupon Mr. Thornton moved adoption of Ordinance 3220 on Second Reading, seconded by Mr. Schroeder and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 5-f. An ordinance establishing a maximum speed limit for railroad traffic within the City limits of Naples; providing a penalty for violation thereof and providing an effective date. Purpose: To provide a maximum speed limit for railroad traffic within the City of Naples.

City Attorney Rynders read the above titled ordinance by title for Council's consideration on Second Reading; whereupon Mayor Anderson opened the Public Hearing at 9:56 a.m.

Let the record show the Mr. Holland left the Council Chambers at 9:56 a.m.

There being no one to speak for or against, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 9:57 a.m.; whereupon Mr. Thornton moved adoption of Ordinance 3221 on Second Reading, seconded by Mr. McGrath and carried 5-1 with Mr. Schroeder voting no and Mr. Holland being absent.

AGENDA ITEM 5-g. An ordinance regulating the manner of operation and speed of vessels in the City of Naples; providing definitions for the terms used herein; providing a procedure for establishing restricted areas; providing exemptions from the provisions hereof; providing for conflict and severability; providing a penalty and effective date. Purpose: To provide regulations for the operation and speed of boats.

City Attorney Rynders read the above referenced ordinance by title for consideration by Council on Second Reading; whereupon Mayor Anderson opened the Public Hearing at 9:58 a.m. There being no one to speak for or against, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 9:59 a.m.

Let the record show that Mr. Holland returned to Council Chambers at 10:00 a.m. and Mr. Wood left the Council Chambers at 10:00 a.m.

Mr. Twerdahl moved adoption of Ordinance 3222 on Second Reading, seconded by Mr. McGrath. In answer to a question from Mr. Schroeder about setting speed limits in the open water near the beaches, the City Attorney stated that this ordinance would set up procedures for doing this. Motion carried on roll call vote, 6-0 with Mr. Wood being absent.

AGENDA ITEM 6. PUBLIC HEARING: For the purpose of considering the establishment of restricted boat areas to be designated "No Wake - Idle Speed Only", at the following locations:

That certain area of the Gordon River located inside Gordon Pass, between Cutlass Cove and Gordon Pass, in front of the Keewaydin Dock facilities, bordered on the south by a line running east and west and passing through marker 7A, bordered on the north by a line running through markers 9 and 10, and bordered on the east and west by the shoreline of the Gordon River.

And also:

All residential canals within the City of Naples, excluding the bays and coves of Port Royal and Cutlass Cove.

And for the purpose of considering the establishment of restricted boating areas, to be designated "Slow Down - Minimum Wake", at the following locations:

All residential bays and coves of Port Royal and Cutlass Cove.

And also:

That portion of Naples Bay bordered on the north by U. S. 41 and on the west by the shore of the Bay, bordered on the south by a line passing through markers 34 and 35, and on the east by the eastern border of the marked channel in Naples Bay from marker 34 to the eastern bridge of U. S. 41.

Mayor Anderson opened the Public Hearing at 10:02 a.m.; whereupon Erroll Pace addressed Council requesting that all of Port Royal bays and coves be included in the "No Wake - Idle Speed Only" designation as per his letter of April 3, 1979 (Attachment #2).

Let the record show that Mr. Wood returned to Council Chambers at 10:03 a.m.

Discussion ensued on how to accurately define "Idle Speed" and "Slow Speed" with regard to the wake created. Mayor Anderson noted that these were state terms and the City was obliged to use them. Lombard Squires and J. P. Maloney addressed Council to emphasize the points made by Mr. Pace. Tyler Janney spoke to Council stating that he felt the ordinance that was governing these designations was a bit vague. Harry Rothchild stated his doubts about the enforceability of the ordinance and Fred Mitchell of the Keewaydin Dock responded that he had talked to the marine police officers who will be responsible for enforcing the ordinance and he reported their opinion of the ordinance was that it was a good one. Sam Aronoff addressed Council and stated that these speeds have been enforced where designated on the East Coast and it was his opinion that they could be enforced in Naples Bay. There being no one else to speak for or against, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 10:48 a.m. Mr. Twerdahl moved that Council approve the locations as set forth, seconded by Mr. Thornton and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 7. PUBLIC HEARING: To consider an application for dock construction on Lots 19, 20 and 21, Oyster Bay (Chesapeake Avenue, Royal Harbor Area), owner, Chesapeake Pt. Developers, Inc., agent, James E. Hirst, P.E.

City Attorney Rynders read the below titled resolution by title for Council's consideration.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A PERMIT FOR DOCK CONSTRUCTION ON LOTS 19, 20 AND 21, OYSTER BAY, UNIT #5, PLAT BOOK 4, PAGE 55, PUBLIC RECORDS OF COLLIER COUNTY, FLORIDA, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ATTACHED DRAWINGS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mayor Anderson opened the Public Hearing at 10:50 a.m.; whereupon Charles Nelson presented himself to address Council. He noted a petition that he had hand-delivered on this date (Attachment #3) opposing the construction and he spoke in opposition to it. Curt Boqvist also spoke in opposition to the resolution. Jim Hirst, agent for the owners, explained to Council the reasons for the construction of this dock. There being no one else to speak for or against, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 11:10 a.m. Mr. Schroeder moved adoption of Resolution 3223, seconded by Mr. Twerdahl and carried on roll call vote, 5-2 with Mr. McGrath and Mr. Wood voting no.

AGENDA ITEM 8. A resolution recognizing Mental Health Awareness Week in the City of Naples to avail themselves of the educational programs relating to mental health, excessive use of alcohol and drug abuse offered by local agencies; and providing an effective date. Requested by Mental Health Association.

City Attorney Rynders read the above referenced resolution by title for Council's consideration; whereupon Mr. Thornton moved to adopt Resolution 3224, seconded by Mr. McGrath and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 9. Discussion of concern for improvement of the appearance of a wood frame house recently moved to the St. Ann School property. Requested by Councilman Wood.

Councilman Wood explained why he had placed this item on the Agenda and Fr. Thomas Goggin addressed Council and reported that he was waiting for his contractor to completely secure the house in question so further improvements could be accomplished.

AGENDA ITEM 10. A resolution appointing a Selection Committee for the purpose of evaluating various architectural firms regarding their qualifications and ability to provide architectural services relative to construction of a multi-purpose center at Fleischmann Park; and providing an effective date. Requested by City Manager.

City Attorney Rynders read the above titled resolution by title for Council's consideration; whereupon Mr. Twerdahl moved to adopt Resolution 3225, seconded by Mr. Schroeder and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 11. A resolution accepting easements for the construction and maintenance of the Golden Gate Raw Water Transmission Main; and providing an effective date. Requested by City Attorney.

City Attorney Rynders read the above captioned resolution by title for consideration by Council; whereupon Mr. Thornton moved to adopt Resolution 3226, seconded by Mr. Twerdahl and carried on roll call vote, 7-0. Mayor Anderson confirmed with Ted Smallwood, Consulting Engineer, that this completed the easements necessary for the Golden Gate Raw Water Transmission Main.

AGENDA ITEM 12. A resolution awarding bid to Southeast Underground Construction, Inc., Cape Coral, Florida, for construction of a water transmission main along Pine Ridge Road and Seagate Drive; and authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to execute a contract therefor. Requested by Public Works Director.

City Attorney Rynders read the above referenced resolution by title for consideration by Council. In answer to Mr. Holland's question, Ted Smallwood, Consulting Engineer, explained the need for this transmission main. Mr. Thornton moved to adopt Resolution 3227, seconded by Mr. Schroeder and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 13. A resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to execute an agreement with the Seaboard Coast Line Railroad Company, whereby said railroad company grants to the City the right to install and maintain a water main across the right-of-way and under the main track of said railroad company, as more particularly described in said agreement, dated March 7, 1979, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of this resolution; and providing an effective date. Requested by Consulting Engineer.

City Attorney Rynders read the above titled resolution by title for Council's consideration. In response to Mayor Anderson's question, Ted Smallwood explained that this type of agreement was handled by resolution as required by the railroad. Mr. Thornton moved to adopt Resolution 3228, seconded by Mr. Holland and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 14. A resolution authorizing the sale to Collier County of surplus mobile office units owned by the City of Naples. Requested by City Manager.

City Attorney Rynders read the below titled resolution by title for consideration by Council.

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE OFFER OF COLLIER COUNTY TO PURCHASE FOUR (4) SURPLUS MOBILE OFFICES FROM THE CITY FOR THE TOTAL SUM OF \$20,000.00; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Schroeder moved adoption of Resolution 3229, seconded by Mr. Twerdahl and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

City Attorney Rynders read the below titled resolution by title for Council's consideration, including the name of Weeks Equipment Co., Tampa, Florida.

Mr. Wood moved adoption of Resolution 3230, seconded by Mr. Schroeder and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 15-b. Request to waive bidding procedure - traffic controllers and detectors for Engineering Department.

City Attorney Rynders read the below referenced resolution by title for consideration by Council.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF THREE (3) TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND FOUR (4) DETECTORS THROUGH STATE NEGOTIATED CONTRACT, WAIVING THE REQUIREMENT FOR PUBLIC BIDDING THEREON; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Wood moved adoption of Resolution 3231, seconded by Mr. Schroeder and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

AGENDA ITEM 15-c. Bid award - Automobiles and trucks for various departments.

City Attorney Rynders read the below captioned resolution by title for Council's consideration.

A RESOLUTION AWARDED BIDS FOR THE CITY'S ANNUAL REQUIREMENTS FOR AUTOMOBILES AND TRUCKS; AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ISSUE PURCHASE ORDERS THEREFOR; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Thornton moved adoption of Resolution 3232, seconded by Mr. McGrath and carried on roll call vote, 6-1 with Mr. Holland voting no.

AGENDA ITEM 15-d. Bid award - Riding turf mower and 3-reel gang mower for Parks & Recreation Department.

City Attorney Rynders read the below titled resolution by title for Council's consideration.

Mr. Wood moved adoption of Resolution 3233, seconded by Mr. Schroeder. Mayor Anderson confirmed with Mark Wiltsie of Purchasing that the bid was a fair and reasonable price. Motion carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

Inasmuch as Agenda Item 16 was scheduled to be taken up at 12:00 noon, Mayor Anderson requested City Manager Patterson to explain the need to add the next item to the Agenda. The City Manager noted that it pertained to work that had to be completed before the rainy season started. Mr. Thornton moved that this item be added to the Agenda on an emergency basis, seconded by Mr. Schroeder and carried on roll call vote, 7-0.

City Attorney Rynders read the below titled resolution by title for Council's consideration.

A RESOLUTION REJECTING THE BID SUBMITTED FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A SEWAGE PUMP STATION, AUTHORIZING THE PROJECT TO BE READVERTISED FOR BIDS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Schroeder moved to adopt Resolution 3234, seconded by Mr. Twerdahl and carried on roll call vote, 7-0

Mayor Anderson stated that a resolution approving the County's proposal for funding the construction of Coastland Boulevard will be presented at the next Regular Meeting. Mr. McGrath suggested calling the road "Golden Gate Parkway" all the way to U.S. 41.

Let the record show that Mayor Anderson recessed the meeting at 11:45 a.m. and reconvened the meeting at 11:59 a.m. with all members of Council present.

AGENDA ITEM 16. Bid award for the purchase of \$2,250,000 City of Naples, Florida, Utilities Services Taxes Revenue Certificates, Series 1975. Requested by Fiscal Agent.

Mayor Anderson ascertained with Franklin Jones, Finance Director, and Ken Atkins, Fiscal Agent, that the bids had been received and that someone had been stationed at City Hall in case any were received there prior to 12:00 p.m. It being 12:00 p.m., the bids were opened and read aloud by Ken Atkins. He noted that it appeared that Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith and Fischer, Johnson, Allen & Burke were the two low bidders and Mr. Jones asked for a short recess while the bids were tabulated.

Let the record show that Mayor Anderson recessed the meeting at 12:17 p.m. and reconvened it at 12:44 p.m. with all members of Council present except Mr. Thornton who had left at 12:35 p.m.

Finance Director Franklin Jones reported that Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith were the successful bidders, noting the Average Net Interest Cost Rate of 5.9460%. City Attorney Rynders read the below titled resolution by title including the name of Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith for Council's consideration.

A RESOLUTION AWARDING THE UTILITIES SERVICES TAXES REVENUE CERTIFICATES, SERIES 1975 OF THE CITY OF NAPLES, FLORIDA TO THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER; FIXING THE INTEREST RATES FOR THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING USE OF AN OFFICIAL STATEMENT IN CONNECTION WITH DISTRIBUTION OF SUCH BONDS AND OTHER ACTION IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE AND DELIVERY OF SUCH BONDS; DESIGNATING THE PAYING AGENT IN CONNECTION WITH THE BONDS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Schroeder moved adoption of Resolution 3235, seconded by Mr. McGrath and carried on roll call vote, 6-0.

There being no further business to come before this Regular Meeting of the Naples City Council, Mayor Anderson adjourned the meeting at 12:47 p.m.

SUBJECT: Ordinance for the Designation of Certain Areas of the Water ways located within the City Limits of the City of Naples as "NO WAKE-IDLE SPEED ONLY".

TO: THE MAYOR AND MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL, CITY OF NAPLES, FL.

The objective of this ordinance is long overdue and should be implemented as soon as possible before serious accidents occur and to offer some measure of protection all docked boats and the rip rap and sea walls of the water ways of the City of Naples.

I live at 3695 Nelson's Walk, Lot 13A of the Port Royal Subdivision. I have a boat docked there and for the last four years I have suffered damage to my boat, dock and rip rap as a result of boats passing at high speed, throwing large wakes. I have done everything possible, i.e. installing bumpers on the dock, using large fenders and installing "Whips" in an effort to cope with inexperienced boaters, boaters that should not be allowed on the water and boaters that do not consider anyone else, plus water skiing on the canal that connects Naples Bay and Galleon Cove.

I realize that this ordinance will not solve all problems but I submit that including the "Port Royal Bays and Coves" in the "NO WAKE-IDLE SPEED ONLY" will at least furnish a means for some enforcement of sanity on the water ways.

It is requested that consideration be given for including all of Port Royal Bays and Coves in the "NO WAKE-IDLE SPEED ONLY" portion of the ordinance. Further "Slow Down-Minimum Wake" should apply to Naples Bay through Gordons Pass where not otherwise designated.

If you determine that it is not possible to include all of Port Royal Bays and Coves in the "NO WAKE-IDLE SPEED ONLY" designation, I request that the body of water that leads from Naples Bay into Galleon Cove be specifically designated a canal under the ordinance. Such canal be considered beginning at an imaginary line drawn from the dock of the Lee Doerr house on Nelson's Walk to the point of land at the Peter Van Arsdale house on Galleon Drive and ending approximately 500 yards Northerly in Galleon Cove.
