BACKGROUND:

The TAB reviews the Comprehensive Plan and the proposed Capital Improvement Program each year.

Comprehensive Plan Discussion and Recommendation

This year the Board reviewed and discussed the Plan at their meetings of June 3 and July 1. In addition to a status review of the various programs and projects related to the Plan; the staff presented a recently-completed Historical Preservation Report and a "visuals usrvey," of portions of the City, with suggestions for various beautification-related Historyements.

The Board requested that the staff review the suggested beautification improvements with the Naples Beautification Council and to seek their recommendation. The Beautification Council (see attached letter) endorsed the idea of a street tree-planting program on Route 41, which in turn as accepted by the PAB subject to a staff review of DOT require-

We have reviewed DOT's street tree-planting criteria and believe we can work within the guidelines and still improve the appearance of Route 41 from 5th Avenue South to 12th Avenue North. The PAB recommends that the City Council approve and fund a street tree-planting program on Route 41 from 5th Avenue South to 12th Avenue North in the 1982-83 C.I.P.

Capital Improvement Program Discussion and Recommendation

The PAB discussed the proposed CIP at their July 1st meeting, and specifically recommended the rebuilding of the City Dock be included as a 1982-83 project; and that the proposed improvement include a general upgrading of the appearance of the Crayton Cove area, from 8th Street to the enrance of the dock itself. The Board also expressed the opinion that the new dock should be an attractive facility in keeping with the "Naples" Image
