MY NAME IS H. WALLACE POSTON. I HAVE BEEN A RESIDENT OF NAPLES FOR OVER FIVE YEARS. I AM AN ENGINEER WITH EXPERIENCE IN THE FIELDS OF WATER SUPPLY, SEWAGE TREATMENT, SOLID WASTE, AIR POLLUTION, AND NOISE POLLUTION AT LOCAL, STATE, AND THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT LEVELS. I WANT TO MAKE IT CLEAR THAT I AM NOT LOOKING FOR PAY BUT WOULD BE GLAD TO GIVE OF MY TIME AND COUNSEL IN THESE IMPORTANT MATTERS.

I RESPECTFULLY REQUEST THAT THE RAISING OF RATES FOR SOLID WASTE COLLECTION BE DELAYED UNTIL THE ECONOMICS OF ALTERNATIVE PROCEDURES ARE DETERMINED. SOLID WASTES DISPOSAL CHARGES FOR THE COUNTY LANDFILL HAVE GONE FROM \$0 TO \$6 TO \$9/TON IN THE PAST 3 YEARS. AN INCREASE OF 35% IS ANTICIPATED THIS YEAR. DISPOSAL COSTS OF THIRTY DOLLARS PER TON ARE ALREADY IN EFFECT IN SOME AREAS OF THE STATE. THIS TRANSLATES INTO COSTS, FOR THE CITY OF NAPLES, GOING FROM \$0 TO \$9600 TO \$15900 TO \$23800 PER MONTH IN THE PERIOD FROM 1982 TO 1985. THESE COSTS ARE ONLY FOR THE RIGHT TO DISPOSE OF WASTES AT THE LANDFILL AND DO NOT INCLUDE ANY LABOR OR EQUIPMENT COSTS INVOLVED WITH COLLECTION OR HAULING.

CONSERVATION OR RECYCLING PRACTICES WHEREBY SOME OF THE WASTES DO NOT REQUIRE LANDFILLING COULD RESULT IN AN APPRECIABLE SAVINGS TO THE CITY. Good Morning, Mr. Mayor and Councilmen:

My name is J. Sandy Scatena and my Wife and I reside At 2990 Binnacle Drive, Naples, Florida. We have lived in the City of Naples for over 12 years, have owned Properties in Collier County since 1967 and in 1975 we opened A Women's Apparel Shop-Clothes Rack At 539 Fifth Ave., So.

Every Ordinance passed by this Council for the City of Naples, controls in some way what we the Citizens, Property and Business Owners in the City of Naples can legally do. Thus I am here today, AS A Concerned Citizen, at this Public Hearing for the 2nd Reading of the Ordinance to discuss increases in charges for garbage and refuse pick-up service for residential, multi-family and commercial customers.

In past years, I have appeared before Council numerous times to discuss the increasing costs of collecting garbage and refuse in the City of Naples. Then, as now, I believe that increases in garbage and refuse fees that are deemed necessary by A responsible City Council are justified in order to maintain our high quality of life here in the City of Naples.

My biggest concern is that you as the City Council, are being exceedingly unfair to the Taxpayers as you are constantly "lepping" these Service Charges and then "putting yourselves on the back" by stating that the "Millage Rate" for the City of Naples has not been increased for the past several

years. In the "Naples Daily News" dated Thurs, Aug. 2nd - it states that a house assessed at \$100,000.00 would be taxed \$133.98 by the City - in another article in the "Naples Daily News" dated Fri, Aug 31, 1984 - it states that under the proposed terms of these new garbage rates which we are discussing today - a single family home will pay \$84.03 for garbage pick-up for the fiscal year 1984/1985 starting October 1, 1984. Thus, if these new increases in Garbage/Refuse Rates are passed by you today - these Service Charges would be approximately 4/3's of a City Property owner's Ad Valorem tax.

Many concerned Citizens such as myself believe that Garbage/Refuse Fees should be included in the Ad Valorem Taxes. It is obvious that at the rate the Service Charges for Garbage/Refuse are increasing - the Average Property Owner will be paying more in Service Charges to the City of Naples than his yearly Ad Valorem taxes.

Thus, I strongly advocate that in the coming months - you review your Garbage/Refuse Service Charges and that they be included in our Ad-Valorem taxes for the fiscal year 1985/1986. This, in my opinion, is the only fair and equitable way to handle these constant increases in garbage/refuse rates for the benefit of the majority of the Taxpayers in the City of Naples.

Initial Nod Given to Garbage Rate Hikes

Naples City Council voted unanimously this morning to increase garbage pickup rates from between 21 and 35.4 percent. Raising the rates will allow the city collection service to pay for itself, according to City Manager Frank Jones.

Jones told the council new rates will cover costs to operate the system, pay a Collier County landfill fee and buy new trucks needed during the next five years. GARBAGE SERVICE income is placed in the city's general operating fund

now, but the money will be put in a separate fund next year, according to the city manager.

The separate fund will be used to make sure all trash service income is used for operations, new equipment and the landfill costs, Jones added.

THIRTY-THREE councilmen during budget planning for the 1983-84 fiscal year, Jones told the council.

"We have calculated the new rates according to the total cost of service and equipment," Jones said. The residential garbage service increase must be 21 percent, the yard

trash service raise must be 24 percent and the rate increases for commercial garbage service will range from 6 to 35.4 percent, determined.

The city's annual expense for lawn debris collection is \$342,238, including \$326,238 for operations and \$16,000 for equipment, the city manager added. He said the city dumps lawn debris at its own landfill.

Commercial trash removal costs the city \$486,226 per year, including \$330,279 for operations, \$78,000 to dump at the county landfill and \$107,947 for new trucks, including removal according to Jones. Last

June, he told the council the city needs about \$1.3 million worth of new sanitation equipment through 1987.

BACKGROUND: During August of 1982, there was some discussion regarding the garbage fees and perhaps placing those fees in the ad valorem taxes. The reason provided by those in favor of doing this was that it had advantages for tax purposes.

ANALYSIS: Following is a presentation reflecting current residential fees as a fixed amount of \$75.48 per year and relating that figure to a cost determined by a millage added to the property tax.

CONCLUSIONS: I feel that any tax advantages realized by including this fee in the property tax will be limited to a very small class of individuals specifically those residential customers who file itemized tax returns. Commercial customers already get the deduction and many residential users will not be eligible for itemizing their deductions. The major disadvantage is that the resident, except for the breakeven point, will not pay the value of the service he receives. Those who live in homes valued at more than \$90,000 will pay more and those living in homes appraised less than \$90,000 will pay less. I hope this provides you with the information you need and I will be available to discuss it with you at your convenience.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO GARBAGE AND REFUSE CHARGES; AMENDING CHAPTER 10 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NAPLES BY REPEALING PARAGRAPHS (c) AND (d) FROM SUBSECTION (B) (2) OF SECTION 10-9 AND SUBSTITUTING A NEW PARAGRAPH (c) THEREFOR AND BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 10-10 THERETO; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

PURPOSE: TO REVISE THE RATES FOR COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE AND REFUSE TYPE I FOR MULTIUSERS AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROPERTY OWNER TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PAYMENT OF ALL GARBAGE AND REFUSE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL CHARGES, WITH CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPLES, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. Property taxes in Naples next year will not increase, according to a \$39 million 1984-85 budget released Wednesday by Naples City Manager Frank Jones.

The millage rate will dip slightly — from 1.4621 to 1.3390 — but a comparable rise in property values means tax bills will remain level,

Jones explained.

City millage rates have dropped slightly each year since 1976-77.

IF JONES' proposed budget remains intact after scrutiny by City Council and public hearings this summer, city staff will work with slightly more than \$7.3 million in general operating funds, an increase of 6.8 percent, and nearly \$9.5 million in utility operating

funds.

Capital improvements in excess of \$21 million — \$19 million for the long-planned expansion of sewer and water treatment facilities — make up the bulk of the budget. A bond issue will cover initial water and sewer system costs.

Of the 1.339-mill tax rate, 1.2591 is earmarked for the operating (Please see TAXES, Page 2A)

fund and .0748 to pay the city's debt obligations.

A mill is equal to \$1 tax on every \$1,000 of property value. A house assessed at \$100,000 would be taxed \$133.90 by the city.

"I BELIEVE the budget as recommended will allow us to continue our present high level of service," Jones concluded in his re-

port.

To achieve the balanced budget with no tax increase, initial departmental requests were sliced by \$365,000, Jones said.

Jones expects a substantial increase in city revenues, buoyed by the recently approved, countywide, 2-cent gas tax, which will contribute \$100,000 for street mainte-

nance.

In addition, Jones predicts the city will collect \$150,000 more in fees and franchises than it did this year, and \$50,000 more in fines and charges, Jones said.

Meanwhile, new revenues associated with the expansion of the municipal dock will add \$70,000 to the parks and recreation budget.

BACKGROUND:

Garbage rates are reviewed each year based on our budgeted costs to insure that revenues generated will cover 100% of residential and commercial refuse collection costs and 25% of trash collection costs. In these costs we are absorbing \$193,404 of capital costs in our Capital Improvement fund. County landfill fees have also increased from \$6.00 to \$9.00 per ton, or 50%, and are a major contributor to our rate adjustment requests.

ANALYSIS:

Schedules are attached that reflect Fiscal Year 1985 estimates. A comparison of rates with Lee and Collier counties and the City of Cape Coral are also provided with the attachments.

The total proposed increases in the annual rates to our residential customers are \$5.43 for garbage and \$1.54 for trash, or a total annual increase of \$6.97 (9%). Multifamily customers' rates will increase from \$42.10 per year for garbage and \$5.70 per year for trash to \$45.72 and \$6.33, respectively. This is a total annual increase of \$4.25, or 9%.

Commercial customers will see their rates increase from 24% to 61% depending on the size of container and the frequency of pickup. The lowest level of service will see the largest increase because the fixed costs are a higher percentage of the total cost of service than at the highest level of service. Multiusers of containers will experience the minimum increase, from \$5.26 to \$5.75 per month, or 9% for one to eight cubic yards per month.

Current rates for motels, hotels, and apartments is \$6.90 per year per room. The current rate for other businesses or institutions not covered by the above schedule which are using garbage cans is \$34.50 per year for up to two 30 gallon cans and \$15.00 per year for each additional can.

The proposed rates for motels, hotels and apartments is \$7.52 per year per room. The proposed rate for other businesses or institutions is \$37.60 per year for up to two 30 gallon cans and \$16.35 per year for each additional can.

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

I suggest we adopt the proposed rates for residential, multifamily, and commercial customers to be effective October 1, 1984.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CHARGES FOR GARBAGE AND REFUSE PICKUP SERVICE; AMENDING SECTION 10-9 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NAPLES, FLORIDA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. PURPOSE: TO INCREASE CHARGES FOR GARBAGE AND REFUSE PICKUP SERVICE FOR RESIDENTIAL, MULTIFAMILY AND COMMERCIAL CUSTOMERS.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPLES, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. That Section 10-9, entitled "Charges for Garbage and Refuse Type I Pickup; Definitions; Billing," is hereby amended by amending Subsections (B) (1) (a), (b), (c) and (d), (B) (2) (a) and (c) and (C) (1) and (2) to read as follows:

Sec. 10-9. Charges for Garbage and Refuse Type I Pickup; Definitions; Billing.

(B) Schedule of fees for collection and disposal of garbage and refuse Type I. The following schedule of garbage and refuse Type I collection fees is hereby adopted:

(1) Garbage can rates, minimum rates per year, two (2) pickups per week:

(a) Single-family residence* - Sixty-eight dollars and fifty-eight cents (\$68.58) per year.

*Each mobile home space constitutes a single-family resident unit.

(b) Multifamily residence - Forty-five dollars and seventy-two cents (\$45.72) per year per living unit.

(c) Business or institution. Rooms (in motels, hotels and apartments, no cooking facilities) - seven dollars and fifty-two cents (\$7.52) per year per room.

(d) Other. Businesses or institutions not covered by the above schedule which are using garbage cans shall be charged at the rate of thirty-seven dollars and sixty cents (\$37.60) per year for up to two (2) thirty (30) gallon cans and sixteen dollars and thirty-five cents (\$16.35) per year for each additional can.


