Ms. Smallood provided a brief slide presentation.</p> <p>Purpose of presentation was to encourage City Council and staff to accelerate our U.S. 41 median landscaping efforts to complete improvements from Orchid Drive to Neapolitan Way. (Approx. 2½ miles)</p>					

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Estimated cost of preceding is \$500,000.00.

In response to question, Terry Fedelem indicated annual maintenance costs associated with this particular 2½ miles of median is \$100,000 per year. This is in addition to existing maintenance costs.

Mayor Putzell requested the Chamber encourage store owners along U.S. 41 to plant flowers, shrubs, etc. in front of their businesses.

9:40 a.m. Continuation of Discussions on Goals and Objectives.

(15) Improve Pace of City Government

Mayor Putzell indicated his desire to improve the pace of city government and be more timely and responsive to the public. In addition, Mayor Putzell requested staff review their individual operations to accomplish economy and better allocation of resources.

10:00 a.m. Presentation by Fleischmann Trust

Presentation by Bill Vines and Charles Long on their proposed use(s) of property adjacent to existing city boundry along Goodlette Road and Golden Gate Parkway.

Purpose of presentation to determine interest city might have regarding possible annexation of this property.

Roger Barry indicated an advantage of annexation prior to development would be a more active role in development of regional impact (D.R.I.) plan by the city.

Councilman Graver asked if proposed plan included a site for the Philharmonic. Mr. Vines' response indicated that a site has been planned for this activity.

Mayor Putzell requested a future workshop to coincide with a visit from the Fleischmann Trust's retained land use planner from San Francisco.

Mr. Barry responded that it may be prudent to employ a reputable land planner to advise the city on considerations regarding growth in general.

City Manager Jones indicated requests for proposals were being received from engineering firms to complete a study on airport noise, safety and location.

General discussion that engineering work should not duplicate F.A.A. noise study.

(18) Pelican Bay Water Agreement

An update from City Manager regarding status of negotiations with Pelican Bay for bulk sale of potable water.

(14) Relations with County

City Manager Jones provided update status of three matters currently pending which relate to Collier County; i.e., North Naples water pressure, street maintenance, and double taxation.

(19) Sale of Alcoholic Beverages on Sundays by Non-Profit Organizations

First reading of ordinance to be on May 21, 1986.

(20) Status of Capital Improvement Budget

City Manager Jones indicated he would be providing at the next Council a summary of capital improvement program projects and appropriations for same.

Mayor Putzell expressed his concern that improvements to Lowdermilk Park should be done this year and not wait until 1986/87 fiscal year.

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In response to the minutes of the most recent "Save-the-Bays" meeting, the Mayor was to write a letter to this association that although financial support was not possible at this time for maintenance dredging, the subject would be addressed once the City's Natural Resources Manager was hired.

City Manager Jones indicated he would provide Mayor and Council with an updated status report on Goals and Objectives.

City Engineer Jerry Grovold distributed information regarding Gordon River Bridge.

Fire Chief Norris Ijams distributed material regarding the City's evacuation plan and related information.
