Additionally, it was brought to everyone's attention that no consideration has been given to the possibility of reimbursement of personal expenses.

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DISCUSSION OF WATER/SEWER AGREEMENTS WITH COLLIER COUNTY ITEM 3

Pelican Bay has requested that the City service their area. Councilman Richardson requested reviewing the issue of water/sewers because of the funding of bonds and to advise the public of boundaries and where the City was headed. City Manager Jones noted a draft agreement he had prepared which is agreeable to the City and Pelican Bay, pending Council approval. This contract would provide for the servicing of Pelican Bay for 5 years with the capacity to renew every 5 years. Pelican Bay would pay the City \$195 per unit for system development charges. Park Shore resident, Dave Bennett, expressed his concern about adding additional customers since the Park Shore area has experienced extremely low water pressure and their water supply has been cut back. Resident Charlie Andrews also voiced his concern over the same issue. Jim Chaffee, Utilities Director, explained the mechanics of a plan that would ultimately improve the service in Park Shore via the new lines installed for Pelican Bay and noted that a variance has already been requested by City Manager Jones from the Water Management District which would provide some relief to the Park Shore residents.

Mr. Chaffee also outlined sewer areas now serviced. Those areas currently on septic systems were brought to Council's attention and Mayor Putzell requested the City Manager to contact the County for an ordinance to have those septic systems changed to sewer systems.

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CLASSIFICATION OF IMPROVEMENTS - LOWDERMILK/CAMBIER ITEM 4

Palmer Communications has contacted the Mayor with regard to having a picnic in Cambier Park to raise money for the Band Shell. This will alleviate the City of some of the burden and allow monies to be directed elsewhere. City Manager Jones was not clear on the split for Cambier/Lowdermilk improvements. Mayor Putzell explained that these improvements were for shade trees, picnic tables, Band Shell, etc. Council agreed that the cost should be split over two years and an advertising campaign would be developed to educate the public on the improvements.

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PACE ADVERTISEMENT ITEM 5

Pace is an in-flight magazine put out by Piedmont Airlines. They will be dedicating their December issue to Collier County. Councilman Richardson inquired as to whether the City would be interested in taking out an ad since the County will do so. Council decided not to participate.
