City Manager Jones explained that one of objectives of the 86-87 Capital Improvement Program was to complete the loop of the bike path system. This was originally outlined in the Comprehensive Plan first approved in 1979, he said. There are three areas to be addressed, the first being the section along 8th Avenue North to Central along Gulf Shore Boulevard. He said that the City's objective was to build a system that would enhance the safety of bikers, joggers and pedestrians. Mr. Jones

He said that this publication discourages multiple use sidewalks and further that it was his understanding that the right-of-way was only six feet which, according to the "Guide", is insufficient to establish a bike path that would be consistent with the standards. 

Extremely high tides have been predicted for the last few days of 1986.

Tides higher than three feet may occur in the Naples area during the late evening of the 29th, 30th and 31st of December. If strong onshore winds, particularly a winter storm, hit during this time, serious tidal flooding may occur along our beaches and in Naples Bay.

Boat owners whose boats are in the water should be sure that their mooring lines have sufficient scope to accommodate a 1.5 to 2 foot increase in tide height.


Boat owners who keep their boats on the beach should remove them, since higher high tides will probably completely cover most of the beach. Boats stored in the City of Naples beach access rights-of-way that are pulled or washed shoreward into the sea oats or access structures will be removed at their owners' expense.

Dear Mayor Putzell:

We are interested in the issue of the bike path/sidewalk proposed for Gulfshore Boulevard south of the Naples Beach Hotel & Golf Club. Unfortunately, due to a scheduling conflict, neither Michael nor myself will be able to attend the workshop this morning. We have some questions regarding the utilization of the path for multiple purposes, however we do generally support a sidewalk along the west side of Gulfshore Boulevard.

We feel that a five foot wide path should be earmarked principally for pedestrian usage. The compatibility of bicycles and pedestrians on such a path is questionable. Active bicyclists who are interested purely in exercise will likely continue to use main roads. I am certain many of our hotel guests and many local residents would use a sidewalk for early morning and late afternoon exercise. We see many people walking and jogging along Gulfshore Boulevard north of our resort doing just that every day.

Once again, I'm sorry we cannot be represented at your workshop, but we are interested in the future utilization of Gulfshore Boulevard. We look forward to participating in such discussions in the future.
