This revetment could environmentally impact the area in a positive fashion by providing an intertidal habitat, he said.</p> <p>Mayor Putzell asked how deep the water level was and Dr. Staiger replied that the depth was between -3 and -4 NGVD (National Geodetic Vertical Datum, below mean sea level). The rip-rap would be extended approximately 8 feet into the Bay at a slope ratio of 2 to 1, he further explained. In response to Mr. Graver, staff noted that the only other alternative to this revetment would be a complete seawall replacement which could be costly.</p> <p>Mr. William Johnson, agent for the petitioner, pointed out that the Department of Environmental Regulation (DER) encourages such construction as it promotes intertidal habitat. Referring to seawall cap replacement, Councilman Crawford asked if it could easily be replaced after such a revetment was constructed. Mr. Johnson advised that it could.

Mr. Muenzer asked how the material would be brought in to which Mr. Johnson replied that it would be transported either by barge or via the owner's property. There would be no infringement upon adjacent properties, he said.

The Department of Environmental Regulation (DER) has exempted certain maintenance dredging requests for canals and boat slips from the permit application process, therefore, the City staff has proposed an ordinance to coincide with DER's policy. Dr. Staiger further commented that DER would have final jurisdiction over any such dredging requests.</p> <p>Mayor Putzell asked how the City would supervise construction of these requests to which Dr. Staiger responded that he would personally inspect proposed sites and would ensure that intertidal habitat is preserved by stipulating such in the City permit obtained by the applicant.</p>

Referring to Section (c) of the ordinance, Mr. Crawford asked for clarification of the activities exempted from this ordinance. Dr. Staiger pointed out that this clause was requested by The Conservancy to preserve coral zones close to shore and was not intended to restrict maintenance dredging of shipping channels such as the upcoming Gordon Pass dredging.

PURPOSE: TO INCLUDE BOTTLE CLUBS IN THE REGULATION OF HOURS OF SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

Title read by City Attorney Rynders.

Assistant City Manager Wiltsie advised that this proposed ordinance would bring area bottle clubs into compliance with nightclub regulations; this includes limiting the consumption of alcohol to certain hours.

Mayor Putzell suggested that the fifth line of Section (d) of the ordinance be amended to include: "individual club members 'or their guests' bring..."

R. B. Tucker, President of Mariner's Cove Condominium Association, spoke in favor of the ordinance as it would require these clubs to close when area nightclubs do.

Mr. Jack Schloss, owner of a bottle club called Secrets, explained that the purpose of these establishments was to allow those individuals who work in nightclubs and restaurants a place to relax and socialize. He then suggested that his club be given a six-month probation period, to be reviewed by Council, to determine whether the public's health and safety would be jeopardized by such an operation. Mayor Putzell, however, pointed out that the Council must make such determinations regarding public health, safety and welfare now, not after a tragic incident.

In response to Councilman Muenzer, Mr. Tucker advised that patrons of the club do not park in the Mariner's Cove lot because it is blocked by parking bumpers. He, however, pointed out that there currently is a dispute between Harbortowne Mall and his condominium association regarding the ownership and use of this entranceway.

Police Chief Reble commented that his department has had no problem with this club thus far, but noted that additional patrols are needed in that area until 6:00 a.m. when the club closes.

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Mr. Crawford said that he believed it important to maintain consistency of the hours of alcohol consumption and further stated that all types of clubs should be required to conform. Mrs. Anderson-McDonald added that this ordinance was not intended to specifically regulate the use of one club, but was intended to provide conformance throughout the City of Naples.

Community Services Director Holley explained that this Agreement would enable the City to perform its U.S. 41 median beautification simultaneously with the Department of Transportation's (DOT) U.S. 41 widening project. Mr. Holley, however, suggested that the City request an amendment to the contract wherein it provides that if the contracted bid price exceeds the City's cost estimate for the project, the City has the right to reject said bid.

Referring to Section 2, sub-section D, of the proposed Agreement, Mayor Putzell asked that staff contact the DOT to determine if the clause regarding landscaping maintenance could be removed inasmuch as the City would be responsible for such maintenance costs. Mr. Crawford concurred.

Mr. Graver asked what was included in the State's normal procedure for replacing medians. Mr. Holley explained that the normal practice was to place bahia sod or seed in the median after the project is complete, but with this Agreement, the City can lay its effluent reuse lines and then landscape the median.

Councilman Richardson supported this Agreement and further asked staff to contact the DOT to determine if it would allow the City to lay effluent reuse lines north to Pine Ridge Road.

MOTION: To APPROVE the resolution with the direction of staff to contact the DOT regarding deletion of Section 2, sub-section D.

Assistant City Manager Wiltsie explained that this Committee was necessary to review engineering consultant proposals submitted for maintenance dredging of the special taxing districts. Councilman Richardson, however, said he believed such engineering services could be accomplished in-house. The Engineering Department could perform such work, City Engineer Gronvold confirmed, but it would necessitate the hiring of additional personnel. He further estimated the consultant cost to be approximately 8% of the total project.

In response to Mr. Graver, City Attorney Rynders explained that the newly appointed Citizens Advisory Committee could only review submitted proposals as it was not designed for contract administration work. Mr. Rynders further pointed out that Council would be the determining factor for either appointing an engineering consultant or requiring staff to complete the work in-house.

Mr. Richardson suggested that staff contact other cities which have implemented such districts regarding their maintenance dredging procedures.

Councilman Muenzer asked that the Citizens Advisory Committee report to Council its recommendations regarding the proposals.

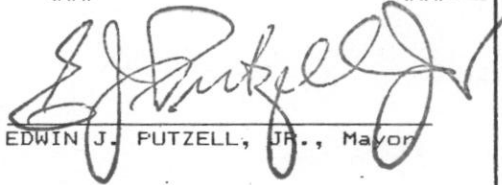
