No one present to speak for or against.						4
City Manager Jones asked Council to hold the public hearing on this matter, but continue the second reading until its next meeting. He noted that staff had received a letter from the Collier County Builders and Contractors Association (CCBCA) relative to the legality and use of the proposed interim impact fees (a copy of which can be reviewed from the meeting packet in the Office of the City Clerk). Mr. Jones said that he wanted to complete a data analysis of this proposal prior to Council's consideration at second reading.						
In response to Councilman Anderson, City Attorney Rynders advised that he agreed with the CCBCA that the City must obtain data supporting the levy of the fee on commercial structures; however, he said that he could not support the remaining allegations by the CCBCA relative to the use of collected fees.						
Councilman Anderson asked for clarification relative to Section 11.A.(1) of the ordinance exempting the altering of certain commercial space. City Attorney Rynders explained that the only commercial structures which would be exempt from the fee would pertain to those not increasing their square footage. Any additional space to said commercial structures would be subject to the impact fee.						3
Mayor Crawford noted that a section had been added to the ordinance to provide for refunding in the event the interim fee was greater than the final impact fee. He further asked if there was a mechanism by which the City could collect fees retroactively in the event that the final fee was greater than the interim fee. City Attorney Rynders advised that no such mechanism had been added to this ordinance.						
Discussion then ensued relative to Section 11.A.(3), replacement of an existing residential building with a structure of the same type and size. Mayor Crawford asked if a building increased by 5% would also be subject to the impact fee. City Manager Jones pointed out that there was an appeal process through the City Manager for such cases. He further noted that he did not believe there would be very many cases where that would occur.

Community Development Director McKim pointed out that the petitioners were improving an existing non-conformity which was encouraged by the City's Comprehensive Development Code. While the optimum benefit to the City would be complete compliance with existing requirements, the Code provides for non-conformities to exist if certain criteria has been met, she said.  Mr. Kevin Miller, YMCA staff, advised that he has not yet approached the Naples Daily News relative to obtaining two additional parking spaces in order to accommodate 90 children. He noted that his group was uncertain whether it could serve 90 children. In response to Councilman Herms, Mr. Miller noted that the dumpster was located in the middle of the parking lot, in accordance with the Engineering Department's request. That location, he continued, would require the garbage truck to back out into the street after it had emptied the dumpster.  MOTION: To APPROVE the resolutions accepting staff conditions (1) through (5), limiting the number of children to 80. The second secon	that this project had been reviewed and revised several times by the petitioner in response to the Planning Advisory Board (PAB) and staff's concerns. The proposed site plan before Council at these proceedings, subject to the stipulations outlined in Attorney David N. Morrison's letter of September 14, 1990 (Attachment #2), has been recommended for approval by the staff. The PAB has not reviewed the revised site plan.						
	Councilman Passidomo said that he believed the outstanding issues relative to this project were the setbacks from the waterfront and the building height. He further noted that his understanding of the setback requirement was to provide that the adjacent property owners' view was not impaired by structures constructed on the lot line. In this case, Mr. Passidomo continued, there are no property owners who would be affected by the setback encroachment. Community Development Director McKim, however, noted that staff and the PAB believed that a larger setback was crucial in this area because of the extensive use proposed for pedestrian traffic. The greater setbacks also enhance the aesthetic value of the project, she said.						
	Discussion then ensued relative to the required width of sidewalks in accordance with Code. Community Development Director McKim noted that 5 feet does not provide sufficient space for two pedestrians to pass comfortably, 8 to 12 feet provides ample space to pass.						
	Councilman Muenzer noted that the PAB had also expressed concern relative to a "step" feature from the plaza to the sidewalk. Mrs. McKim advised that the petitioner has committed to provide at least 12 feet and 20 feet of space in certain areas; however, he has not indicated whether those widths would include the proposed boardwalk system.						
	Attorney Pam Mac'Kie of Cummings and Lockwood, representing the petitioner, urged Council to approve the petition and asked that the proposed four stories over parking for the office building

She said she believed the petitioner has met all the PAB and staff's concerns and has indicated a willingness to work with the City to develop this project. Mayor Crawford said that he could not support the additional height for the proposed office building. The citizenry has spoken on that issue and supported the limitation of three stories for such structures, he said. Mayor Crawford noted that he believed the three stories over parking was much more appropriate for this site, and he would, therefore, support that site plan. Referring to the PAB's recommendation of denial for this project, Councilman Muenzer pointed out if that Board had been provided with the site plan presented at these proceedings, it probably would have recommended approval. There were only a few minor problems that the PAB had encountered which effected the negative vote. Discussion then ensued as to the mixed use element for the project. Councilman Anderson said that she was excited about the opportunity to have a project that could be viable and active in this area of the City. She then asked if the proposed mixed use element was economically viable for the petitioner to pursue. Community Development Director McKim noted that while the mixed use element has been successful in many other areas of the City, Swan Court on Third Street for example, it depended entirely upon the location and design of the residential units. She further noted that staff has not required this development incorporate the mixed use element, it was merely a suggestion. Councilman Herms asked where the proposed location for the 8 additional residential units would be. Mr. Miller indicated on the site plan at the dais the location of those 8 units. They will be above the buildings adjacent to the waterfront, he said. Referring to the site plan, Councilman Herms pointed out that those 8 units would be adding additional square footage to the project. Mr. Miller confirmed that they would. Mr. Herms said

Dear Michael:

As you know, this firm represents Kevin Stoneburner in his proposed acquisition and development of the above-referenced parcel. On behalf of our client, enclosed is a list of agreements and items which we will supply to the City of Naples and its legal counsel prior to the second reading of the rezoning petition.

- Shared Parking Agreement between the various land owners of the project and the City of Naples insuring proper utilization and control of the parking areas at the project. Among the provisions of that Agreement will be a stipulation that the Naples Players Theater and the office building will not be in used at the same times.
- Relocation of the existing emergency access easement from Goodlette Road to the Mariner's Cove Condominium project, and relocation of the utility easement currently existing between Goodlette Road and Mariner's Cove Condominium project.
- A common area maintenance agreement to insure proper maintenance and upkeep of the various common areas of the project.
- A ten-foot corridor management easement as provided under the Comprehensive Development Code along Goodlette Road. The City of Naples, at its sole expense, shall install and maintain whatever landscaping and additional fixtures and furnishings desired by the City for such ten-foot easement.

- 5. Our client will agree to your request that our client construct eight (8) additional residential apartment units as part of the project, such units to be located over the one story waterfront commercial area.
- 6. Our client will agree that the height of the office building proposed for the project will either consist of three (3) stories over parking or four (4) stories over parking, depending upon the decision of the City Council. We note that the purchaser of the office building parcel has expressed a desire to construct a building consisting of four (4) stories over parking and we have requested that the purchaser, through its counsel, coordinate their request through you.
- 7. Our client will dedicate a non-exclusive public access easement along the waterfront pedestrian area to be constructed along the southerly boundary of the property directly adjacent to the Gordon River.
- 8. Our client will amend the current parking lease arrangement with the Comfort Inn property so as to redesignate the specific parking places reserved for the use of Comfort Inn patrons. The purpose of the lease amendments would be modify the parking arrangements shown in the lease to conform to the proposed arrangements of the project.
- 9. Our client will provide an architectural rendering of the entire project reflecting the current status of the project.
- 10. Our client will provide a revised landscape plan reflecting the current status of the project.
- 11. Our client will, at his expense, supply and locate stop signs at the three-way stop located within the center of the project.
- 12. Our client has agreed that all service and dumpster areas will be appropriately screened from public view.
- 13. Regarding the public access easement along the waterfront pedestrian area at the south boundary of the property, our client has agreed that not more than 30% of the frontage length of buildings located along said waterfront pedestrian area shall contain covered outdoor seating located 12 feet from the "waterside" edge of the waterfront pedestrian area as constructed, and that the remaining 70% of the structures located along the said waterfront pedestrian area shall be located a minimum distance of 20 feet from the "waterside" edge of the waterfront pedestrian area as located. In the event that our client shall be unable to
