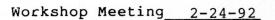
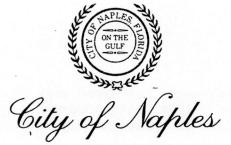

did not seem logical. Council should decide which costs should be charged to the City and which to the Taxing District. Dr. Woodruff said that Save the Bays is of the opinion that \$31,000.00 should be reimbursed to the Taxing District.						
Mr. Merill Johnson, also a member of the Board, reviewed the resolution before Council. He said that it should serve as a model for other Taxing Districts as it was an orderly way for the City to approach the problem of maintaining the waterways. Mayor Muenzer noted that whatever action was taken by Council it would necessitate equal treatment for the East Naples Bay Special Taxing District Advisory Board. The group could be scheduled for a workshop at a future date.						
Dr. Woodruff reviewed some of the pertinent issues at hand. Save the Bays Organization believes the City should pay \$9,873.97, the amount charged to the Taxing District before the referendum was passed. The Advisory Board believes it should be charged to the Taxing District.						
The City paid \$17,360.00 for more than forty storm drains, removal of silt and sand buildup.	į					
The Taxing District should not be charged for items such as copies, minute taking, etc.						
With respect to dredging permits, Save the Bays does not believe the Taxing District should have to pay. The concept of a tax to pay for dredging was not popular.						
There were also excess engineering costs. Save the Bays decided to charge the City 10% of those costs to which the Advisory Board agreed.						
Repairs to jetties were not included in the referendum.						
It was the consensus of Council to delay any decisions on the Special Taxing Districts. A
