Council present for both first and second reading. Both readings can be held during this Special Meeting. City Manager Woodruff told Council that when the ordinance was passed adopting the new Dock rate structure, certain changes were not made resulting in conflicts within the ordinance. Interim Community Services Director Kevin Rambosk explained that if a vessel stays at the Dock longer than two weeks, it becomes a permanent vessel. That changes the City's ability to charge the rate structure for transient vessels, which is substantially more. Mr. Rambosk reviewed the transient rental revenue from January, 1991 compared to January, 1992 as well as February, 1991 compared to February, 1992. Those figures reflect a 25.63% increase in January, 1992 and a 163.37% increase in February, 1992. Mr. Rambosk noted that a portion of that increase is due to a small increase in rental fee, however, staff believes that more than 20% of that increase comes from the new business strategy to lengthen stays. He said that the specific request is to adopt a new definition for a transient vessel versus a regular permanent vessel. MOTION: To APPROVE the ordinance on an emergency basis.
