City Council Special Meeting – September 3, 2008 – 5:04 p.m.

PUBLIC HEARINGS – (TENTATIVE MILLAGE AND BUDGET).....ITEM 2-a THE FIRST SUBSTANTIVE ISSUE IS THE PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN MILLAGE OVER THE ROLLED-BACK RATE NECESSARY TO FUND THE BUDGET, IF ANY, AND THE SPECIFIC PURPOSES FOR WHICH AD VALOREM TAX REVENUES ARE BEING INCREASED. (THE GENERAL PUBLIC SHALL BE ALLOWED TO SPEAK AND TO ASK QUESTIONS PRIOR TO ADOPTION OF ANY MEASURES BY THE **GOVERNING BODY.)** Finance Director Ann Marie Ricardi noted that, as a special meeting, no items except those on the agenda may be considered; she also said that the final budget hearings would occur on September 17, 2008, at 5:05 p.m. The proposed millage rate for the City of Naples is 1.1315 which reflects a balanced budget with no percentage over the roll back rate utilized, Ms. Ricardi noted.

Public Comment: (5:07 p.m.) (It is noted for the record that documentation provided by public speakers is contained in the file for this meeting in the City Clerk's Office.) The following speakers voiced support of the proposed art gallery to be located in the Gordon River pedestrian underpass (US 41), proposing a partnership between the City and private sources, funding for which had been deleted from the fiscal year 2008-09 budget: Lois Bolin, 1300 Third Street South, Vin DePasquale, Attorney Richard Yoyanovich, representing Bayfront business complex, John Callis, representing Tin City, Lou Vlasho, 700 Fifth Avenue South, Matthew Kragh, 1520 Blue Point Avenue, #102, Linda Bloom, 3260 Bermuda Isle Circle, #718, Trista Kragh, 1520 Blue Point Avenue, #102, and Joel Kessler, representing von Liebig Art Association. Also speaking were the following: Sue Smith, 11th Avenue South, stating that although she supported the proposed millage rate, she disagreed with the loss of employees due to budgetary issues. Mark Steiner and Irwin Scharfeld, AFSCME Union representatives, also took issue with the loss of employees, noting their belief that reserves should have been utilized, at least in regard to five employees who had been unable to procure employment elsewhere. Following public comment, Council indicated that while it fully supported the project, it could not, in light of the current economic situation, designate funding for the aforementioned art project. It was noted that \$25,000 had been earmarked for this budgetary cycle and \$25,000 for the next. Various of the above speakers said that they believed at least \$50,000 had been committed from private sources and that more was to be pursued.

Title read by City Manager William Moss (5:47 p.m.). Discussion of the above noted pedestrian underpass continued. Council Member Willkomm expressed support of the project and the desire to reinstate funding. Council Member Sorey urged that those involved with the project continue their efforts, complete its design, ascertain the complete cost, and at that time request that Council consider a budget amendment. He also cautioned that the necessary permitting from the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) had not been obtained to date, and that possible grant funding from the Tourist Development Council (TDC) could be also be sought.

Council Member Price explained that he supported the project, but that if funding could be found within the budget, he would first support reinstating employees; Council Member Willkomm agreed.
