- 3. Public Comment J. Chirgwin, December Town Hall Meeting features D. Sulick. 8:30 a.m.
- 4. Water Quality Policy Issues. The Conservancy of S.W. Florida will present a summary of EPA water quality policies resulting from legal challenges regarding water quality regulations in the State of Florida. A representative from FDEP will offer information from the State's regulatory perspective, and staff will summarize potential impacts and costs. Consensus not to take a position until staff has an opportunity to perform further analysis and report back.

- 5. Presentation by Fifth Avenue South Property Owners of the Market Research Report. Property owners on Fifth Avenue South retained the services of Robert Gibbs of the Gibbs Planning Group to assess conditions and make recommendations to improve the business environment. Lou Vlasho and Robert Gibbs will summarize the report. *Discussion only*.
- 6. Report on Local Economic Development. The Collier County Economic Development Council will summarize economic development initiatives. Dr. Allen Weiss, President and CEO of the Naples Community Hospital, will summarize recent initiatives to attract businesses in the health care sector. *Discussion only*.
- 7. Five-Year Financial Sustainability Report. Mid-term budgetary planning is used to assess the financial condition of the City over the next five years. The estimated revenues and expenditures provide guidance for the preparation of the FY 2010-11 capital and operating budgets. *Discussion only*.

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- 8. Discussion of Regulations Governing Guest Units. Policy guidance is required for the permitting of guest units. Currently, guest units are allowed in certain single-family zoning districts, but they must be detached from the main dwelling unit. Some property owners have sought to have guest units attached to the main dwelling unit. Recommended are options for amendment to the City Code. *Consensus to proceed with revisions* (6-1 / Price dissenting).
- 9. Consolidation of Communications Center. One of the budget reduction strategies proposed last year was the consolidation of the City's 911 emergency call center, which services Naples Police and Fire-Rescue, with the Sheriff's Office 911 emergency call center. City Council requested further information. Presented is a summary of discussions with the Sheriff's Office and a recommendation. *Discussion only*.
- 10. Status of Application for Bicycle Friendly Community. The City submitted an application to the League of American Bicyclists to attain recognition as a "Bicycle Friendly Community". Step 1 required submittal of a General Community Profile including an "Action Plan" to determine if the City meets the basic criteria. Step 2 required completion of a detailed audit of the engineering, education, enforcement and evaluation efforts in our community. The response from the League will be summarized to determine future direction. *Discussion only*.
- 11. Sign Code Amendments. Proposed for discussion are amendments to the Code of Ordinances that regulate signage. Consensus to differentiate amendments prompted by legal issues and those dealing with aesthetics; proceed with review process recommended by the City Attorney (Planning Advisory Board/PAB and Design Review Board/DRB) after further Council review of the above differentiated material.
- 12. Discussion Regarding Community Festivals. City Council recently amended policies regarding the number and location of special events. The Community Redevelopment Agency suggested at least two community festivals should be held this year. The topic will include discussion on the merit, types of events, locations, organization and financing, and proposed dates. Consensus that staff facilitate City-sponsored community festival to be scheduled following Easter.
