### ORDINANCE 97-8045

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FIFTH AVENUE SOUTH SPECIAL OVERLAY DISTRICT REGULATING PLAN AS REFERENCED IN SECTION 102-1094(g) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES IN ORDER TO REVISE THE LOCATION OF A SITE DESIGNATED FOR A PARKING STRUCTURE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, A REPEALER PROVISION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

- WHEREAS, City staff has been instructed to amend the Fifth Avenue South Special Overlay District Regulating Plan as referenced in Section 102-1094(g) of the Code of Ordinances in order to revise the location of a site designated for a parking structure; and
- WHEREAS, following an advertised public hearing, the Planning Advisory Board considered the public input, the recommendation of the staff, the recommendation of the Staff Action Committee, and the standards and guidelines of Subsection 86-201.1, "Petition for change in text," and recommended by a vote of 7 to 0 that Text Amendment Petition 97-T9 be granted, finding that the criteria had been met;
- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council to so amend the Fifth Avenue South Special Overlay District Regulating Plan as referenced in Section 102-1094(g) of the Code of Ordinances to revise the location of a site designated for a parking structure;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPLES, FLORIDA:

- Section 1. That the Fifth Avenue South Special Overlay District Regulating Plan as referenced in Section 102-1094(g) of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended in order to revise the location of a site designated for a parking structure as indicated on the attached Exhibit "A."
- If any word, phrase, clause, subsection or section of this ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the validity of any remaining portions of this ordinance.
- That all sections or parts of sections of the Code of Municipal Section 3. Ordinances, all ordinances or parts of ordinances, and all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption at second Section 4. reading.



Request: This is a request to amend the Fifth Avenue South Special Overlay District Regulating Plan as referenced in Section 102-1094(g) of the Code of Ordinances in order to revise the location of a site designated for a parking structure.

Authorization: Section 86-201.1 of the Code of Ordinances, "Petition for change in text."

Background: The Regulating Plan for Fifth Avenue South specified three possible locations for parking garages; two of the sites are City-owned property, and the site in question is located on private property. The property owner filed a petition with the Staff Action Committee (SAC) earlier this year, requesting to construct a 12-unit condominium on the property, necessitating a change in the designation of the site for a parking structure. The SAC recommended approval of the project by a vote of 3 to 0, with the provision that the Regulating Plan be revised to reduce the portion of the site identified for a parking structure.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends approval of the revision to the Regulating Plan attached as Exhibit "A." The Regulating Plan has also been revised to show the location of the Naples Players' Theater and the parking structure.

Public Imput: None.

Meeting Summary/PAB Vote: On July 9, 1997, the Planning Advisory Board voted 7 to 0 to recommend approval of Text Amendment Petition 97-T9.

Additional PAB Comments: PAB Member Hole suggested that at some point in the future City Council reconsider the traffic circle at Fifth Avenue South and U.S. 41.

1. REQUEST: This is a request to amend the Fifth Avenue South Special Overlay District Regulation Plan as reference in Section 102-1094(g) of the Code of Ordinances in order to revise the location of a site designated for a parking structure.

- 2. BACKGROUND: The Regulating Plan for 5th Avenue South specified three possible locations for parking garages; two of the sites are City-owned property, and the site in question is located on private property. The petitioner filed a petition with the Staff Action Committee (SAC) earlier this year, requesting to construct a 12-unit condominium on the property, necessitating a change in the designation of the site for a parking structure. The SAC recommended approval of the project by a vote of 3 to 0, with the provision that the Regulating Plan be revised to reduce the portion of the site identified for a parking structure.
- 3. PENDING AND/OR SUBSEQUENT ACTION: The Planning Advisory Board (PAB) will hold a public hearing on this petition at its meeting on Wednesday, July 9, 1997. At the close of the public hearing, the PAB will make a recommendation to the City Council. First reading of an ordinance adopting this text amendment will be scheduled for the August 6, 1997 City Council meeting.
- 4. STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of the revision to the Regulating Plan attached as Exhibit "A."




# Existing Regulating Plan

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO EXECUTE AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH COLLIER COUNTY, IN SUBSTANTIALLY THE FORM ATTACHED HERETO, TO PROVIDE FISCAL YEAR 1998 FUNDING FOR THE NAPLES BEACH ACCESS IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT IN AN AMOUNT NOT-TO-EXCEED \$25,000; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. City Manager Richard Woodruff reported that Collier County had allocated \$25,000, to be matched by the City for refurbishing the beach ends. Assistant City Manager William Harrison explained that it would require \$250,000 to update every beach end over a five year period, and, unless more funds were forthcoming, the task could not be completed with a \$50,000 budget. Council Member Van Arsdale suggested the use of tourist tax dollars, and Dr. Woodruff said staff would explore this avenue of funding.
