Flood Insurance

A week after widespread flooding in Florida from Hurricane Ian, FEMA's National Flood Insurance Program policyholders are receiving funds to help start their recovery. To date, NFIP has provided \$3.5 million in advance payments to policyholders who have started the claim process.

National Flood Insurance Program policy holders and insurance agents can call NFIP with any flood insurance questions at 800-759-8656 or visit Floodsmart.gov. If you have an NFIP policy, ask your agent about advance payment on your claim.

Understanding Your Letter from FEMA

Hurricane Ian survivors who applied for assistance from FEMA will receive a letter from FEMA. The letter will explain your application status and how to respond. It is important to read the letter carefully because it will include the amount of any assistance FEMA may provide and information on the appropriate use of disaster assistance funds. If you have questions about your letter, call the disaster assistance helpline at 800-621-3362 to find out what information FEMA needs.

If You Disagree with FEMA's Decision

FEMA might just need more information. The letter you receive from FEMA will explain what FEMA needs to continue processing your application and how you can respond. You can call 800-621-3362 or visit a Disaster Recovery Center to get help filing an appeal.

How to Apply for FEMA Assistance

Homeowners and renters in the following counties who had uninsured losses from Hurricane Ian may be eligible for federal disaster assistance. FEMA may provide financial help with temporary housing expenses, basic home repairs and other essential disaster-related needs.

Debris Sorting

In cleaning up, sort debris by category: electronics, hazardous waste, construction and demolition debris, large appliances, and plants and trees. Keep each category separate for pickup.

Crisis Cleanup

For help cleaning up the damage from Hurricane Ian, call the Crisis Cleanup Hotline at 800-451-1954. You will be connected to volunteers from local relief organizations, community groups and faith communities. The hotline will remain open through Oct. 28.

Critical Needs Assistance

FEMA may provide financial assistance to applicants who have immediate or critical needs because they are displaced from their primary dwelling. Immediate or critical needs are lifesaving and life-sustaining items, including water, food, first aid, prescriptions, infant formula, diapers, consumable medical supplies, durable medical equipment, personal hygiene items and fuel for transportation. This assistance applies to primary residences in Charlotte, Collier, Desoto, Hillsborough, Lee, Manatee, Osceola, Sarasota, Seminole, and Volusia Counties.

Operation Blue Roof

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, in coordination with FEMA, may be able to assist eligible homeowners with temporary roof repairs. Operation Blue Roof is a free service to homeowners impacted by Hurricane Ian in Charlotte, Collier, Lee, and Sarasota counties. Disaster Unemployment Assistance

To file a claim for loss of income caused by Hurricane Ian, go to Disaster Unemployment Assistance - Florida Jobs.org and select "Apply for Hurricane Ian DUA," visit a local CareerSource Career Center, or call 800-385-3920. Customer service representatives are available Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. ET.

U.S. Small Business Administration



Long-term, low-interest disaster loans for homeowners, renters, businesses and nonprofit organizations from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) are available to cover losses not fully compensated by insurance and other sources. Apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via the SBA's secure website at disasterloanassistance.sba.gov/ela/s/.
