ORDER #2 – DECLARATION OF CURFEW IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS

from 10:00 PM until 6:00 AM

Beginning on 10/3/2022 at 10:00 PM until Rescinded

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Naples, Florida, pursuant to Section 14-38, of the Code of the City of Naples, the Declaration of Local Emergency dated September 27, 2022, and Resolution 2022-14951 dated September 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to reduce the potential injuries and accidents to persons and loss of property in the aftermath of Hurricane Ian; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to prevent scavenging and crimes against persons and property; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to reduce potential conflicts, injuries and accidents to persons and the loss of private and public property and lives in the aftermath of Hurricane Ian; and

WHEREAS, to prevent misunderstandings regarding the intent of pedestrians and vehicles traveling in residential areas of the City during the darkness of late night and early morning; and

WHEREAS, to further protect and safeguard the health, safety, and welfare of the City of Naples residents, visitors and first responders during the state of emergency in residential portions of the City, many of which do not currently have electricity.

I HEREBY DECLARE and impose in response to the current emergency situation:

A **CURFEW WITHIN RESIDENTIAL AREAS OF THE CITY OF NAPLES** to take effect beginning on October 3, 2022, and continue each night and early morning from

**10:00 p.m. until 6 a.m.**

prohibiting persons (including but not limited to pedestrians, bicycles, automobiles, trucks, and/or using other forms of mobility), from traveling on residential streets, roads and sidewalks within the City of Naples in areas that are predominantly single family and multi-family residential areas.

The curfew shall not apply to commercial and industrial zoned areas that include predominantly commercial and industrial uses.

The curfew shall not apply to essential service and first responders including but not limited to police, fire, EMS, ambulances, utilities, emergency calls by physicians and hospital services, including the transportation of patients to a hospital or care facility, and people traveling to and from work.

This curfew shall continue until it is rescinded.

Violations of this Curfew shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding \$500.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 60 days or both such fine and imprisonment.
