Mail & Package Theft Prevention

There have been incidents where mail is being stolen from mailboxes. Thieves are taking the mail to obtain your checks, credit cards, and personal information for the purpose of identity theft. Please follow these crime prevention tips to avoid becoming a victim.

- Remove mail from boxes every day, as soon as possible
- Deposit outgoing mail in slots inside post offices or hand it to mail carriers
- If you change your address, immediately notify the U.S.
 Postal Service and any company with which you do business
- Report mail theft to police and the U.S. Postal Inspection Service at 800-275-8777 (not your local post office)
- Request a vacation hold even if you will be gone for just a few days. This can be done at a post office or online at holdmail.usps.com/holdmail
- Do not send cash in the mail. Sign up for paperless invoices and pay bills online.
- Use a GEL INK PEN when it is necessary to issue and mail checks
- Consult with your local postmaster on the availability of locking mailboxes
